## Independent Reading Redefined

Impactful independent reading is based on four principles: Time, Choice, Talk, and Teacher Support

#### Time

\*Long periods of time are needed for students to transfer previously taught skills and strategies into independence.

### Choice

\*Students have the space to explore, construct, and expand their reader identities.

## Talk

\*Talking aids the development of social comprehension as students learn to listen and express opinions with classmates.

## Teacher Support

\*Simply giving students time to read is NOT the same as independent reading. It needs to be a conscious collaboration between teachers and students.

# Principles of Independent Reading

Principle	Why?	How?
Time	<b>Volume</b> of reading is <b>key</b> in growth	<ul> <li>prioritize independent reading by putting it into your plans first</li> <li>celebrate where students already are in their stamina</li> </ul>
Choice	Students are more <b>motivated</b> to read when they get to <b>choose</b> what they read	<ul> <li>conduct class discussions about</li> <li>considerations when choosing books</li> <li>advertise books and have students</li> <li>advertise books</li> </ul>
Talk	Talk leads to improved comprehension and builds community	— include <b>partner time</b> in independent reading — conduct <b>inquiries</b> into <b>purposeful talk</b>
Teacher Support	Feedback is one of the most impactful tools we have for raising student achievement	<ul> <li>design a schedule that includes</li> <li>conferring and small group work</li> <li>take notes and be prepared to teach</li> </ul>
