





PROVOKE + INSPIRE

SKILL OR STRATEGY

Bring into play picture books, photos, field trips, objects, curriculum areas or memories



INVITE + GREATE

LEARNING INTENTION AND MATERIALS

Gather learner's intention and plan Learners play and create with materials Teachers conference with individuals or small groups


GAPTURE + REGORD

WRITING, DRAWING AND DEVICES

Use devices to photograph, record or video stories

Writing, drawing and art tools available to capture stories





SHARE + REFLECT


STORIES, FEEDBACK AND REFLECTION

Reflect on learning experience and provoke further thinking




What is Story Workshop?

Story Workshop is a structure that supports language and literacy development. Adults work <u>alongside</u> children as they explore prepared environments and experiences.

They may consider...

- * Where do stories live?
- * What stories do I want to world to hear?
- * What stories do I need to tell?
- * How do stories influence me and our community?





Why Story Workshop?



Story Workshop helps teachers work with students who exclaim they have nothing to write about during writing workshop.



Students start to understand that they:

- * can be curious about the environment around them
- * are competent communicators
- * have important stories to tell
- * can make connections to other people's stories
- * have big emotions they can explore and share with others



What role does curiosity play in learning?

The 'wonder' aspect of curiosity — the why and the how quest for understanding rather than fact finding

A goal of curiosity is to prepare the mind for learning. It prepares us to be ready to decide which information we want/need to attend to in situations.



Asking an engaging question can create a more long—lasting value (desire) for learning novel information.

For example - "What do you think happens when ...?"

Children have a natural motivation to explore the world, but we can encourage a more important motivator to explore the mind.

Emotions and Story Workshop

Can you use colours and lines to capture the feeling of angry?



"I used brown and black and I made scribbles because angry things feel scribbles. You might explode."



"When I'm angry, it is a loud angry, like thunder and lightning."



"The pinkness is I'm mad because my cheeks get pink. The redness comes out of my ears like fire coming out of your ears."



Writing Workshop Connection



Preparation: A selection of writing paper, writing utensils,

blank books made of stapled paper, alphabet

charts

Invitation: An empow

An empowering action for students who have created stories through story workshop is to write them down so their story can be accessed

for a long period of time.

Instruction: With both story workshop and writer's

workshop, teachers use students' own writing to

teach writing skills and strategies.



Using Documentation to Inform Practice

Consider
Intentions:

What is your learning intention? What materials will you need? What provocations will you use? What will you invite the children to do?

Prepare:

What do you want to gather more information about? What tools will you need? How will you position yourself to observe with an open mind?

Observe:

Capture through notes, writing down children's dialogue, take photographs to support your memory.

Interpret & Speculate:

What do you notice? What patterns do you see? What evidence do you see that supports your interpretation. What surprises or confuses you?

What are your next steps?
